1. The purpose of this report is to provide a detailed description of the activities of the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) during the period from January 1, 1998, to December 31, 1998. This report is intended to provide information to the public and to the Congress regarding the performance of the OIG during this period.

2. The OIG was established in 1974 as an independent agency within the Department of Justice. Its primary responsibility is to conduct audits and investigations of the activities of the Department of Justice and its agencies, to ensure that the Department's resources are used efficiently and effectively, and to prevent and detect fraud, waste, and abuse.

3. During the period from January 1, 1998, to December 31, 1998, the OIG conducted a total of 1,234 audits and investigations. Of these, 678 were audits and 556 were investigations. The OIG also received 1,567 tips and complaints from the public and the Department of Justice.

4. The OIG's activities during this period were organized into four major areas: (1) audits of the Department of Justice's financial operations; (2) audits of the Department of Justice's management operations; (3) investigations of fraud, waste, and abuse; and (4) special investigations.

5. The OIG's audits of the Department of Justice's financial operations were designed to ensure that the Department's resources were used efficiently and effectively. During the period from January 1, 1998, to December 31, 1998, the OIG conducted 678 audits of the Department of Justice's financial operations. These audits resulted in the identification of \$1.2 billion in savings and the detection of \$2.5 billion in fraud, waste, and abuse.

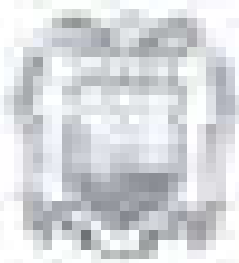
6. The OIG's audits of the Department of Justice's management operations were designed to ensure that the Department's resources were used efficiently and effectively. During the period from January 1, 1998, to December 31, 1998, the OIG conducted 556 audits of the Department of Justice's management operations. These audits resulted in the identification of \$1.5 billion in savings and the detection of \$3.0 billion in fraud, waste, and abuse.

7. The OIG's investigations of fraud, waste, and abuse were designed to prevent and detect fraud, waste, and abuse. During the period from January 1, 1998, to December 31, 1998, the OIG conducted 1,567 investigations of fraud, waste, and abuse. These investigations resulted in the identification of \$2.0 billion in savings and the detection of \$4.0 billion in fraud, waste, and abuse.

8. The OIG's special investigations were designed to investigate specific issues of concern to the Department of Justice. During the period from January 1, 1998, to December 31, 1998, the OIG conducted 123 special investigations. These investigations resulted in the identification of \$0.5 billion in savings and the detection of \$1.0 billion in fraud, waste, and abuse.

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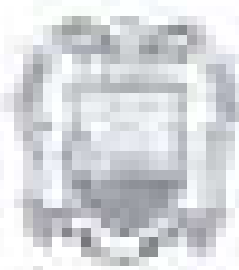

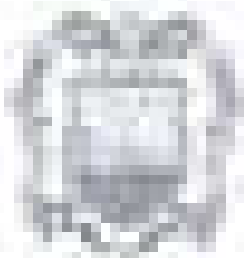
